MLK Holiday DC Parade & Peace Walk: Honoring Dr. King and Uplifting Black Women

Commit to the Noble Struggle for Equal Rights

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The 20th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Peace Walk and Parade will take place in Washington, D.C., on Saturday, January 18, 2025 at 11 AM.

For the first time, the annual event will be held indoors at the Entertainment and Sports Arena (ESA) on the campus of St. Elizabeth's in Southeast.

The theme: **Commit to the Noble Struggle for Equal Rights** amplifies the annual event commemorating Dr. King's enduring legacy of peace, justice, and unity while shining a spotlight on the pivotal but often under-appreciated contributions of Black women in the ongoing fight for civil rights.

Black women have been the backbone of the civil rights movement — often unpaid, invisible, and undervalued. Today, the call to action is clear: those who have benefited from Black women's leadership must step up in their support.

This year also marks 46 years since the first MLK parade was held in the District of Columbia following the assassination of Dr. King on April 4,1968 and before the national holiday was declared in 1994. Singer/composer Stevie Wonder was the grand marshal on January 15, 1979. He rode alongside parade founders Ward 8 Councilmember Wilhelmina Rolark, Washington Informer Publisher Dr. Calvin W. Rolark and radio talk show and activist Ralph "Waldo" Petey Green.

This year's invited grand marshals include: D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser, Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton, former Mayor Sharon Pratt, and former Councilmembers LaRuby May, Edie Whittington Sandy Allen of Ward 8, and Yvette Alexander of Ward 7.

Event Details

Peace Walk: The parade will be preceded by a Peace Rally beginning at 9:30 AM at Shepherd Park (intersection of MLK & Malcolm X Aves., SE) followed by a one-mile walk promoting unity and peace along MLK Avenue.

Parade Route: The parade will begin at 11:00 AM at Sycamore & Cypress Streets, S.E. and proceed to the Entertainment and Sports Arena on the St. Elizabeths Campus (1100 Oak Dr SE).

The Parade: Participants will perform inside the ESA at center court. There are 2,500 seats available for spectators to see the parade and participate in activities. Registration is required at **mlkholidaydc.org**

Parade Processional

The parade lineup will be on Cypress Street at Sycamore and head east on Cypress St to the rear of the ESA facility.
